Our 51st Build for The Hernandez Perez Family

In the last guarter of 2023, we began a special build for the Hernandez Perez family.

Adriana and Demi are a dynamic mother-daughter duo who push through challenges with grace and determination. Their house is being built to accommodate future accessibility needs due to a degenerative muscular disease. It will be an ADA compliant, single story home set back far enough to add a ramp in front if eventually needed. The house will feature a roll-in shower, grab bars, wider doorways, suitable turning areas for a wheelchair, and an attached garage.

Groundbreaking took place in November, following removal of a large tree on the lot. Since then, the foundation was poured, a wall-raising ceremony was held, and many volunteer groups have donated time to help out on the build.

Home Repair Projects

In 2023, we completed five home repair projects, ranging from the small needs of a current Habitat homeowner to a large heating and electrical update for a home.





Rock The Block

During our September Rock the Block, we partnered with Sheboygan's Sheridan Park neighborhood.

Over the course of three days, we focused on eight home repair sites and four community service projects. The event kicked off on Thursday, September 21, which coincided with United Way's Day of Caring. Work continued on Friday, September 22, and the event came to a close on Saturday, September 23.

Around 130 people volunteered for this event, providing 850 hours of work, to give fellow neighbors a hand up.

What's Coming

There's a lot coming in 2024. While we just had our 30th anniversary, we're hoping to make 2024 our best year yet.

On April 19, 2024, we'll hold our fundraising celebration event, "Raise The Roof." Invitations will be sent out once tickets are available for purchase, so be sure to save the date.
