2023 In Review

A word from the Habitat for Humanity Lakeside Executive Director, Niki Zohrab



2023 marked a significant milestone for us on two fronts - the 30th anniversary of our affiliate and the completion of a home for our 50th family. Against the backdrop of soaring housing costs, these events carry even greater importance.

We kicked off the year with a memorable celebration as the Tin-Aye family achieved homeownership at the end of January. The momentum then continued with the Kairys family in May followed by the Jackson family in July. Managing three simultaneous builds posed a substantial challenge for our small team, but they met it head-on, delivering not only secure and healthy homes but also the crucial support required for first-time homebuyers negotiating the process. In November we broke ground on a home for our 51st family, with anticipated completion in June 2024.

Beyond the dedication poured into constructing three homes, the Construction and Family Services teams successfully managed and completed five Home Repairs. These projects offered assistance to current homeowners in the low-to-moderate income bracket, spanning tasks from simple replacements of brackets on stair handrails, to a more extensive undertaking involving installation of a new HVAC and partial electrical system, ensuring a safe and healthy haven for the homeowners. The latter was completed with a great deal of support from the local SMART and IBEW unions.

September saw our team in Sheboygan's Sheridan Park neighborhood for Rock the Block. This annual revitalization event is the perfect example of bringing people together to make a difference in their community. In 2023, over 130 dedicated volunteers contributed a total of 850 hours, actively participating in 11 projects, including six home repair sites and five community service initiatives.

We take pride in our commitment offering zeropercent interest financing across all our homerelated programs, reinforcing our dedication to providing a hand-up rather than a hand-out.

ReStore experienced a 5% increase in sales during 2023 compared to the previous year. Beyond supporting our affiliate programs financially, this surge in revenue also prevented over 400,000 lbs of building materials, pre-loved furniture, lighting, hardware, and tools from ending up in landfills. The ReStore team remains devoted to fostering community relationships, promoting the store and recycling efforts, thereby offering an alternative disposal solution and further boosting organizational revenue.

As we reflect on these achievements, we eagerly anticipate building upon this success in 2024 and extend our heartfelt appreciation for your continued support.

Featured Homeowners: The Tin-Aye Family

Tha Tin and Khin Aye, originally from Myanmar, came to the United States as refugees, looking for a safe place to call home. With the help of Sheboygan residents, they found Habitat for Humanity Lakeside, and soon began their journey to becoming homeowners.

Right from the outset, the family exhibited a profound dedication with their collaboration with Habitat. Tha's "sweat equity" surpassed the mandatory minimum hours, reflecting a commitment that extended well beyond expectations.





This build truly epitomized the essence of community building. Khin would go above and beyond, surprising the office staff with unannounced lunches on occasion, and insisting on personally preparing dishes for guests during the dedication ceremony, a heartfelt expression of gratitude. As noted by Niki, "Food is Khin's love language. While she may struggle with her English, it is clear that she is extremely grateful for the effort put in by volunteers and staff". Torginol, Tha's employer, played a pivotal role by not only providing financial support, but also volunteers to assist on the project.

Despite having a pre-existing garage on their property, Tha faced challenges with offstreet parking during heavy snowfalls, especially after returning late at night from his second shift job. Undeterred, Tha proactively sought permits from the city to construct a street-accessible parking pad. Drawing on skills acquired through working with Habitat, he and a volunteer added concrete sidewalks alongside the house, showcasing his commitment to problem-solving and maintaining the well-being of his family and home.

The family's pride in homeownership is evident, further enhanced when Nourish Farms, in collaboration with Habitat, assisted them in planting raised garden beds in their yard. Now a family of five, the Tin-Aye family can create lasting memories in a secure and permanent home, all made possible through an affordable mortgage.



Other 2023 Builds

Habitat for Humanity Lakeside completed two additional homes in 2023: in May for the Kairys Family and July for the Jackson Family. The latter was an extra special celebration for our organization as it was the 50th home completed in our Home Buyer program!

We are very proud to have reached this milestone and look forward to the next 50 in the coming years.



Construction also began on our 51st home: the Hernandez-Perez family, which will be completed in spring 2024.


